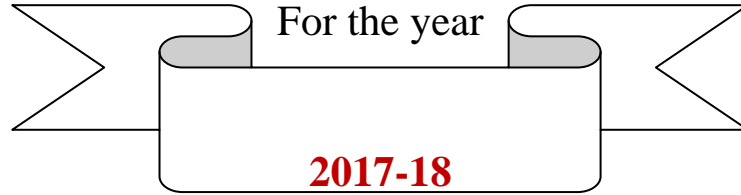

In both these computer lab **Broadband internet** connection is provided which is used by the students and the college staff for educational purpose.

In the physical infrastructure our college has one indoor stadium hall with well equipped instrument and one indoor hall is under construction.
